

# Who Is The New Girl?

After graduating for Florida Gulf Coast University in 2004, Marquelle worked for the Florida Department of Children and Families as an investigator. During one of her first cases, she worked closely with the CAC's Child Protection Team. She decided then that this was where she truly wanted to make a difference. She returned to FGCU and earned her master's in forensic studies. She joined the CAC in March 2009. There are even rumors that she skipped into work the first day.

During her down time, Marquelle enjoys reading and spending time with her family, especially her young niece. Her most prized possessions are her three cats – Majhi, Merrique and Mischief. # CPT Case Coordinators ... what do they actually do?

A Child Protection Team Case Coordinators interview, assess and make recommendations regarding alleged cases of child abuse. That is the simple, technical description. But this is what they really do:

A case coordinator is on-call 24 hours a day. Whenever an abuse call comes in, someone is available to handle the case. This means helping the CPT pediatrician perform a medical exam, removing the child's clothing for evidence, holding the child's hand while a pelvic exam is performed and helping collect DNA evidence. All the while, she is explaining what is happening and reassuring the child that they are safe and the people surrounding them are there to help. Case coordinators try to make this stressful and scary experience more comfortable for the child.

The case coordinator also performs the forensic interview. She sits in an interview room with the child and listens to the often tragic stories,

asking the difficult questions while a Collier County Sheriff's Officer and a DCF protective investigator watch from

the monitoring room. Case coordinators are specially trained to question children. They understand the nuances of how children communicate both verbally and nonverbally. After gathering as much information as possible, they make recommendations to DCF and CCSO.

Our case coordinators have an amazing capacity for compassion and calm during very stressful situations.



# PROGRAM SUMMARY

# **Child Protection Team**

The Child Protection Team (CPT) is an independent, community-based program that provides the needed expertise to evaluate suspected cases of child abuse and neglect, identify risk factors and make appropriate recommendations for intervention and treatment to protect children. CPT works closely with the Department of Children and Families and the Collier County Sheriff's Office. 625 NEW REFERRALS

# Family Safety Program

The Family Safety Program (FSP) was created to promote safety within a family that has already experienced abuse or violence. This court ordered program serves victims of family violence by facilitating supervised visitations and safe exchanges. The CAC provides a monitored environment where children and families may interact safely and appropriately. 274 NEW REFERRALS

# Advocacy

Child Advocates ensure that children referred to the CAC receive the support and services they need as well as assistance in accessing appropriate community services. Advocates provide explanations and direction during this time of crisis and healing. This service is essential to empowering victims and their families. 285 NEW REFERRALS

# Sexual Abuse Treatment Program

The Sexual Abuse Treatment Program (SATP) provides evidence-based therapy to children who have been sexually abused. Individual and family counseling are available to victims, their siblings and non-offending caretakers regardless of ability to pay. Therapy is provided by a licensed mental health professional. This program is a collaborative effort with Catholic Charities of Collier County. 101 NEW REFERRALS

# Parenting Education Program

The Parenting Education Program is for families who have case plans in dependency court. This nine week, court ordered parenting class provides intensive education to focus on the specific needs for each family. 117 NEW REFERRALS


# Partners in Parenting

Partners in Parenting uses the Nurturing Parent program to teach alternative discipline methods and coping strategies. Group classes are offered throughout the community, free of charge. This program is a collaboration with The Children's Hospital of Southwest Florida provided through a grant from NCEF. 698 NEW REFERRALS

# Child Passenger Safety Program

The CAC is an official Child Restraint Inspection and Fitting Station. This free program provides car seat education, consultation and installation instructions.

# Ties To The Community

In late April, we received a phone call from a fifth grade student at Pelican Marsh Elementary. She wanted to invite someone from the CAC to her class for a check presentation. She went on to explain that Mrs. Camp's class had just completed a community service project "Ties to the Community". They organized a raffle for the quilt and researched local children's charities to determine which would receive the proceeds. The class selected the CAC and we were presented with a \$600 check from Mrs. Camp's fifth grade class.

The most amazing thing about this project is that each student took such pride in what they were doing. Everyone worked together to organize the project, make squares for the quilt and sell raffle tickets. They even presented us with a statistics report on the quilt. The queen size quilt weighs 2.5 lbs and they used 1,500 yards of thread to make the quilt, that's .85 miles!

As a staff, we were touched by the hard work and the generous gift. The Children's Advocacy Center is grateful to have children helping children in our community.



New Referrals Skyrocket for Sexual Abuse Treatment Program

It seems like every week there is a new report about abused children in our community. The CAC is thankful we have a resource to offer child victims – especially victims of sexual abuse. The Sexual Abuse Treatment Program (SATP) has seen a dramatic increase in services over the last few months. Referrals for the program have tripled and we are challenged each day to find space to provide therapy sessions.

This evidence-based program is vital to the successful outcomes of these victims. With referrals from the Child Protection Team, SATP is able to engage these children in meaningful therapy as soon as the abuse is discovered. It is hard to imagine the pain of their experiences as they skip down the halls, asking questions and waving to everyone they see on their way to therapy. But when you hear what they say, you realize all too quickly that these children are looking for a renewed sense of security and purpose with the support of the CAC.
